Overview of Disc User's Guide

About these discs

The VMS Consolidated Distribution discs for software products compose a software delivery vehicle that allows you to receive an update of consolidated software products on a regular basis.

This method of distribution does not change the content of any individual product. There is no impact on product compatibility; individual products are neither more nor less compatible as a result of consolidated distribution.

Before using the discs

Before you install, upgrade, or update the VMS operating system from your discs, or before you install a layered product, make sure you are familiar with the system hardware, including the disc drive.

In this guide

This guide describes how to:

- load a disc into a protective caddy
- insert a disc and remove it from the disc drive
- mount and control access to a disc
- read documentation from a disc
- register Product Authorization Keys (PAKs)
- install, upgrade, and update the VMS operating system from a disc
- install layered products from a disc
- use the CDMENU Utility to display the products on a disc and to access documentation in ASCII (text) or PostScript® format

This guide also contains a list of contents of the discs.

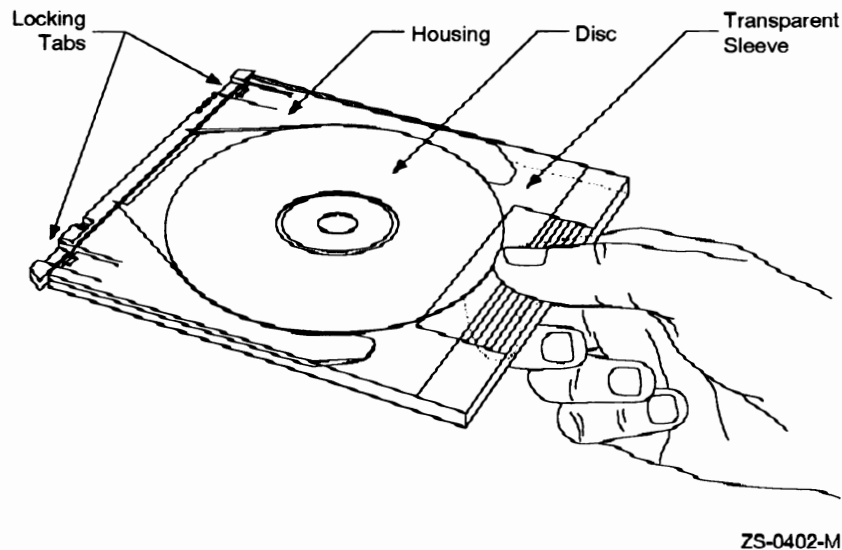

Loading a Disc into a Caddy

Loading a Disc into a Caddy

Figure of disc caddy

The discs accompanying this booklet must be loaded into caddies before they can be inserted into an RRD40 disc drive. The following figure shows the components of a disc caddy.



Loading a disc into a caddy

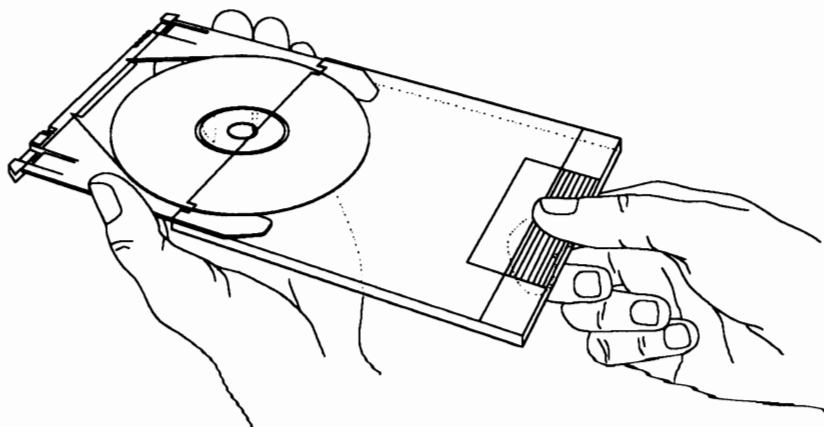
Follow these steps to load a disc into a caddy.

Step	Action
1	Press the locking tabs on the caddy and pull the housing out of the transparent sleeve.
2	Remove the disc from its packaging. Grasp the disc with your free hand by placing your index finger in the center hole of the disc and your thumb on the outer edge of the disc.
3	Place the disc in the caddy housing, making sure that the labeled side faces down.
4	Slide the housing into the transparent sleeve until the locking tabs latch.
<u>Result:</u> The disc is contained in the caddy.

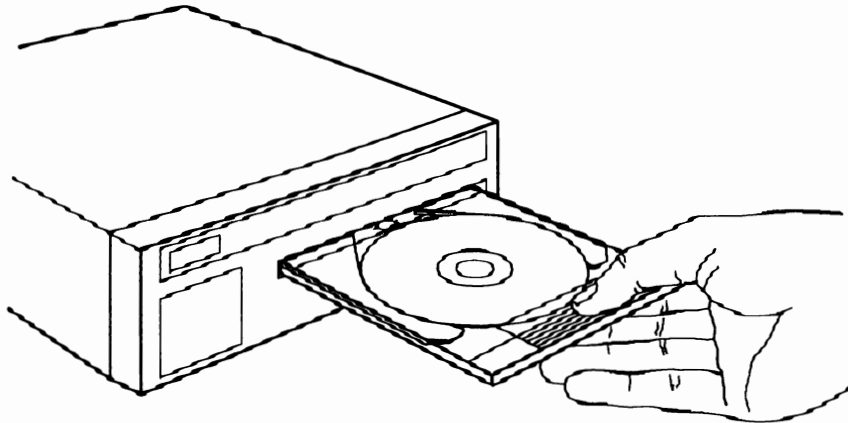

The following figure shows a disc (in its caddy) and the RRD40 disc drive.

Inserting a disc

Follow these steps to insert a disc into the RRD40 disc drive.

Step	Action
1	Insert the caddy into the slot in the drive.
2	Push the caddy in until it stops.
3	Withdraw the caddy.
<u>Result:</u> The disc remains inside the drive.	

Removing a disc

Follow these steps to remove a disc from the RRD40 disc drive.

Step	Action
1	Insert an empty caddy into the slot in the drive.
2	Push the caddy in until it stops.
3	Withdraw the caddy.
<u>Result:</u> The disc is removed from the drive and is contained inside the caddy.	

Mounting and Controlling Access to a Disc

Mounting procedure

To access the files on a VMS Consolidated Distribution for Software Products disc, you must mount the disc. Follow these steps to mount a disc.

Registering Product Authorization Keys

Registering Product Authorization Keys

Prerequisite

When you purchase a software license, you receive a standard Product Authorization Key (PAK), which lets you use the software on the discs. You must register a PAK before you install and use the software products on the discs.

The License Management Facility

For the VMS operating system and VMS layered products, use the License Management Facility (LMF) to register a PAK. For information about registering PAKs, see the *VMS License Management Utility Manual*.

Installing, Upgrading, or Updating the VMS Operating System

Deciding what to do

To decide whether you are going to install, upgrade, or update the VMS operating system, use the following table.

If your VAX computer is...	Then...
new (it has never had any version of the VMS operating system running on it)	install the VMS operating system from the disc using the VMS installation procedure
running a version of the VMS operating system and you want to destroy the contents (both VMS and user files) of the system disk	install the VMS operating system from the disc using the VMS installation procedure
not new, or if it is running a version of the VMS operating system and you do not want to destroy the contents of the system disk	update or upgrade the VMS operating system from the disc

Installing from the disc

For information about installing the VMS operating system, see the appropriate installation documentation for your computer.

CAUTION: Data Erased

The installation procedure initializes the system disk, erasing its contents. For this reason, use the installation procedure only on new VAX computers or if you want to destroy the contents of the system disk.

Upgrading or updating from the disc

Instructions for updating or upgrading the VMS operating system are contained in files on the disc, as well as in the release notes. To find the location of these files, refer to the Disc Contents section.

Booting VMS Standalone BACKUP

VMS Standalone BACKUP is located in the [SYSE] top-level directory on disc one. To invoke Standalone BACKUP, follow the instructions in the appropriate installation documentation for your VAX computer.

Example:

```
B/R5:E0000000 DUB0
```

Substitute the name of your CD reader for DUB0 in the example.

After you boot Standalone BACKUP, refer to the Installation and Upgrade Procedures contained in the VMS directory on the disc.

Installing Layered Products

Installing Layered Products

Disc directory structure

Each software product kit has its own directory hierarchy. The name of the root directory usually corresponds to the name of the product saveset. The kit savesets are located in the KIT subdirectory. For example, the FORTRAN Version 5.3 product directory structure might include the information in the following table.

Installation guide, SPD, and SSA files

- The installation guides for most products are included in the LINE_DOCS and POSTSCRIPT_DOCS directories.
- The Software Product Description (SPD) and System Support Addendum (SSA) files are included in the LINE_DOCS and POSTSCRIPT_DOCS directories.

Using VMSINSTAL

Individual layered product kits are located in their own directory hierarchies. For this reason, when you install a layered product, you must use a VMSINSTAL command line that is slightly different from the one given in the product's installation guide.

When you enter the VMSINSTAL command line, specify the disc drive and the directory.

Command

```
@SYSS$UPDATE:VMSINSTAL product-name disc-drive:[directory]
```

Example:

```
$ @SYSS$UPDATE:VMSINSTAL FORT053 DUB0:[FORT053.KIT]
```

Using the CDMENU Utility

Using the CDMENU Utility

Overview

The CDMENU Utility provides a menu interface that helps you perform the following tasks easily:

- Display a master index of all products
- Display new and updated products
- Fetch or copy release notes
- Display and print installation guides and other documentation
- Install products

Before invoking the CDMENU Utility

Before invoking the CDMENU Utility, define the logical name CD\$DIRECTORY in your LOGIN.COM file.

Example 1:

```
$ DEFINE CD$DIRECTORY DUB0:[CDROM]
```

To access multiple discs, define CD\$DIRECTORY as a search list before you invoke the CDMENU utility.

Example 2:

```
$ DEFINE CD$DIRECTORY DUB0:[CDROM],DUB1:[CDROM],DUB3:[CDROM]
```

In addition, define the logical CD\$EDIT to indicate the editor to use while displaying documentation on your screen.

Example 3:

```
$ DEFINE CD$EDIT LSE
```

Invoking the CDMENU Utility

To invoke the CDMENU Utility, enter the following command at the system prompt:

```
$ RUN CD$DIRECTORY:CDMENU
```

Using Infoserver Disc Identification Labels

Overview

This package contains compact disc identification labels for use with the Infoserver 100 compact disc readers. These labels allow you to identify which disc is being used in a particular reader.

Two files in the [CDROM] directory provide “special notes” for some products on this release. Please review the contents of these files because they may provide useful information for a product.

CD	The number of the disc on which the product is located.
Directory	The name of the product's directory on the disc.
